Reporting to the Director of Addiction Treatment-Recovery Services, the Addictions Case Worker is responsible provides program information and intake and assessment services and assists in the daily facilitation of supporting group therapy to clients and families of the Rainy River First Nations Treatment Recovery Program.

Primary Accountabilities Include:

- Assisting with the delivery of the RRFN Addictions Treatment-Recovery Program, M.A.T. Program.
- Providing support for individuals and families both as part of the program and within the community.
- Coordinating the intake and assessment process and community information delivery.
- Collaborating with healthcare providers and other professionals such as NNADAP Workers, Mental Health Workers, etc.
- Supporting the delivery of induction and tapering of Suboxone medication.
- Transporting medications, and clients to medical assessments and appointments.
- Escorting clients to detoxification and treatment centers.
- Facilitating group sessions.
- Maintaining accurate and up to date reports.
- Participating in an on-call rotation.

- College diploma/certificate in social work or addictions counselling preferred.
- Comprehensive knowledge of issues related to addiction and recovery.
- A preferred minimum of three to five (3-5) years' experience in addiction and recovery services.
- Previous group facilitation experience.
- Knowledge of Rainy River First Nation and the community's culture, beliefs and traditional lifestyles and the socioeconomic conditions of the community.
- Knowledge of the Ojibwe language would be an asset.
- Excellent organizational skills with the ability to work with minimal supervision.
- Strong counselling, interview and assessment skills.
- Demonstrated professionalism and ethics, with the ability to maintain professional boundaries with clients.
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Basic knowledge and willingness to assist in the preparation of statistical reports and program policy and procedures for the Rainy River First Nations' treatment recovery program.
