Community members were not informed about the camera's installation. The camera was reportedly installed by OPP and CBSA. Concerns were raised about the camera's purpose and location. Community members felt disrespected by the lack of communication. The camera was allegedly pointed at the community, not across the river. OPP claimed the camera was for monitoring illegal activities. The camera has been removed, but its current location is unknown. Community members want a communication protocol for future surveillance. Community surveillance initiatives Community members are considering installing their own cameras. Surveillance could help monitor drug houses and illegal activities. 	

• Community members discussed the legality of installing cameras. • Law enforcement cannot direct community members to install cameras. • Community members can share surveillance footage with law enforcement. • Funding for community surveillance initiatives was discussed. • Public Works is in the final stages of acquiring cameras. during the incident.



Future collaboration with law enforcement

- Community members expressed the need for better communication with law enforcement.
- Plans for a follow-up meeting with OPP and other agencies were made.
- Community members want to establish a protocol for future interactions.
- Law enforcement expressed willingness to collaborate and address concerns.
- Community members were encouraged to reach out with any issues.
